### Shale Boom Has OPEC Weighing First Production Cuts In 5 Years

When the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) meets in December, it is rumored that it may slash its level of oil production for the first time in five years, according to the Wall Street Journal.

The organization could vote to reduce oil production by 500.000 barrels per day due to the production surge in North America that is being driven by the shale boom.

OPEC's latest report projected that the demand for its crude will slide 300,000 b/d next year to 29.6 million b/d or about 2.6% less than the organization is currently producing.

The International Energy Agency (IEA) also stated that demand for OPEC oil in 2014 will fail to meet its current production level of around 30 million b/d.

OPEC is concerned with United States and Canadian increases in shale oil production volumes that, while not being exported to other markets, will potentially offset import volumes for those countries from OPEC.

The last time OPEC cut its oil production rate was in late 2008 when it reduced production to 4.2 million b/d, an action that caused prices worldwide to plummet.

## North Dakota Gas, Oil Production Reaches All-Time High In May

North Dakota oil and gas production reached new all-time highs in May, breaking the previous records set in April, despite record rains in May. Primary volume came from Bakken and Three Forks exploration and production activity.

Preliminary estimates by the North Dakota Industrial Commission's (NDIC) Department of Natural Resources indicates that the state's oil production reached record highs over the top numbers achieved in the prior month of April.

## Rig Count Increases In July For Eagle Ford Shale Operations

The Eagle Ford Shale drilling rig count grew by three to average 270 operational rigs in early July. That's the first time the region has seen 270 rigs since the first week in April and only the second time it has reached that threshold in 2013.

The U.S. rig count was up two to 1,759, of which 836 are running in Texas. A total of 362 rigs are targeting natural gas and 1,391 are targeting oil in the U.S.

## **Bowland Shale Seeing Great Potential In New UK Onshore**

The Carboniferous Bowland shale in the central United Kingdom onshore has 822 to 2,281 trillion cubic feet of gas in place, the British Geological Survey estimated in a recent 46-page report, but said the proportion that may be possible to extract is unknown.

The most likely estimate of the resource is 1,329 tcf, the BGS said. The extractable portion would be subject to the economic, geological and social factors that prevail at each operation, it added.

The resource lies in an area between Wrexham and Blackpool.

## EXCO Resources To Purchase Haynesville Shale Assets For \$1B

EXCO Resources, Inc., has agreed to acquire producing and undeveloped oil and gas assets in the Eagle Ford and Haynesville shale formations for a total of \$1 billion from Chesapeake Energy Corp.

Through the acquisitions, EXCO is establishing its position in the South Texas Eagle Ford and expanding its holdings in the Louisiana Haynesville.

EXCO anticipates closing the transactions in July, with the Haynesville acquisition closing first.

## Centrica Acquires 25% Of Key UK Shale License From Cuadrilla

Centrica PLC has acquired a 25% interest in the Bowland exploration license in central England from Cuadrilla Resources Ltd. and AJ Lucas for £40 million cash. It also committed to pay exploration and appraisal costs of as much as £60 million if development proceeds.

Three exploration wells operated by Cuadrilla, of Lichfield, United Kingdom, have confirmed the presence of natural gas in the Carboniferous Bowland shale.
